

Special Award Classes are held to help emerging judges to progress in the Breed. Special award Classes are judged as a separate entity from the Championship Show and are not part of the show proper and does not effect your dogs unbeaten status. You can still challenge for awards if eligible.

YOUR JUDGES

Barrie M Croft (MALCRO) First showed a Rough Collie in 1964 won my first BIS in 1965 with a blue Dane Bitch in 1966 I added an OES a Breed I am best known for. It's a Breed I showed every year for a 50 year period without a break, I have owned and bred Champion Bobtails, breeding my first Champion in my first litter. I have also owned and shown Lhasa Apso, Hungarian Puli and Polish Lowland Sheepdog. I first started judging in 1973 so this year will have been judging dogs for a 50 year period. I am approved to give CCs in 20 Breeds, the Working Group and the Pastoral Group plus BIS at All Breed Championship Show Level. I have also had the pleasure of judging just over 80 shows in 27 different Countries the 1st time in 1985. In 2024 I will have the honour of judging the Pastoral Group at Crufts having also judged 11 Breeds at Crufts. This will be the 3rd time I have given CCs to Samoyed in the UK. I first judge this Breed in 1979 (44 years ago) and been honoured to judge two of your breed club open shows. I look forward to this event and wish you all an enjoyable show.

Lynn Vidak (LACEWOOD) I have had dogs all my life. No one on our estate had pedigree dogs when I was growing up, only "Heinz 57", my preference was always Border Collie type cross breeds. Someone from "the posher" side had 2 of the most glamorous, white, fluffy dogs imaginable, like out of a fairytale. I had no idea what they were or that one day i would eventually own any. My first pedigree dog was in the 1970's, a sheltie. In 1979 the Lacewood affix was granted. 1982 saw our first sheltie litter born, and our "keeper" in turn bred Lacewood's first cc and res cc winners. Lawarded cc's for the first time at WELKS 2000 and to date have awarded 12 sets of cc's. I have judged, at open shows, numerous classes of Rough Collies, Border Collies, AV working, before it was split into 2 groups, and AV pastoral. Fast forward to 2016 and only 1 sheltie, and remembering the beautiful white dogs, which were Samoyeds, this was the breed I now wanted so much. So a trip to Midland counties ch show, I met the lovely Val Freer. She later told me of a litter that was due by Ch Nikara Iced Diamond. In due course I had my very own land cloud. We carefully chose a dog that lined up and bred our first Samoyed litter of which we kept a boy which i show alongside his mum. Having done the Samoyed BAD and passed the MCE, I am now really looking forward to judging the 3 special classes at the NSS show.

SHOW INFORMATION

As was the practice before there will be areas set aside for grooming of exhibits, please use them, there will be no obstructions allowed around the rings (no grooming at the ringside).

If a competitor, or anyone in their household, has Covid-19 related symptoms or has tested positive for Covid-19 they must isolate in line with Government advice. <u>The competitor must</u> not attend the event

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 21st February 2023. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:- (1) Withdrawal The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20. (2) Transfer a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer It to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. **PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. **YEARLING** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) The show will open at 9.30 am.
- (2) Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- (3) Judging will commence at 10.30 a.m
- (4) Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- (5) The entry for Members is £15.00 per dog 1st entry, and for Non-members £18.00 per dog 1st entry. Subsequent entries with the same dog are £2.50. Special Awards classes £2.50 per dog per class NFC £2.50 per dog. Catalogues £3.50 (prepaid only none available on the day)
- (6) Prize money of £5.00 will be awarded to 1st prize winners in the Special Awards classes.
- (7) The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- (8) Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.

- (9) The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- (10) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
- (11) BEST IN SHOW Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- (12) Exhibits will not be admitted to the Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- (13) Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- (14) All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- (15) All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- (16) DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a bus holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. $\[$
 - Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all

reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries:Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

- (17) Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- (18) Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered

(19) No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

Advisory Notes – Additional Rules and Regulations

- Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the
 right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition
 but no entry fees can be refunded.
- Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any
 fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event
 including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be
 provided.
- 3. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
- 4. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
- 5. All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
- 6. Please do not obstruct gangways with trolleys. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/ cages.
- 7. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
- 8. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)
- 9. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.
- 10. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

<u>Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows</u> The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices.

Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

The Kennel Club has also been informed of recent instances of exhibitors commandeering certain areas of a venue in order to have access to power points so as to use electrical grooming equipment. This is totally unacceptable and particularly unfair on the breeds whose allocated areas have been cramped because of this selfish behaviour.

<u>Security at shows</u> In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows.

The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows. The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert. Furthermore the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedures in place.
