1. Copies of support documentation for all accomplishments and titles **must be uploaded to Zooza** before you submit your entry for all entries in the Sieger, Champion or Working classes.
2. Your dog's original registration, hip certification and support documents for all accomplishments and titles **MUST** be available at the show for inspection at the time of check-in and/or the beginning of the class.
4. A valid Hip Certification, pass or fail is required on all dogs over the age of 30 months.

The USRC Registration Certificate may be accepted as proof of titles earned and hip certification if the required information appears on the Registration Certificate.

Classes Offered:

Puppy Classes:

- 4-6 Month Male/Female (optional) - For all Rottweilers between the age of 4-6 months
- 6-9 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 6-9 months
- 9-12 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 9-12 months

Youth Classes:

- 12-18 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 12-18 months
- 18-24 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 18-24 months

Adult Classes

- Open Male/Female - For all Rottweilers 24 months and older
- Champion Male/Female - For all Rottweilers 24 months and older that have earned a USRC recognized Championship (USRC, AKC, CKC or a FCI member kennel club)
- Working Male/Female - For all Rottweilers 24 months and older with a USRC recognized SchH/VP/G/IPO title.
- Sieger/Siegerin Class - For all Rottweilers 24 months and older that have earned a Sieger or Siegerin title at a USRC National or Regional Sieger show or have been awarded the USRC Universal Sieger title.
- Veteran Male/Female (optional) - For all Rottweilers 7 years or older on the day of the show.

When a dog is eligible for more than one class, the dog's owner determines the entry. Photocopies of support documents for all titles and accomplishments must be sent with entry; original documents must be available for inspection at the show. A VALID Hip Certification, pass or fail is required on all dogs 30 months of age or older. Any dog eligible to be awarded the USRC Sieger or Siegerin title must be USRC registered.

Non-Regular Classes

- **Kennel Group (optional)** - Three or more dogs bred by the kennel owner and registered with the kennel name of the entrant. The kennel owner need not be the registered owner of the dogs. All dogs must first be entered in the show's regular classes. Written critiques are not given.
- **Brood Bitch (optional)** Entered by the owner of the brood bitch. The brood bitch and at least two of her produce must appear in the ring. The bitch must have a USRC recognized Breed Test and have been at least 24 months of age at the time of breeding. The class is to be evaluated on the merits of the produce. The owner of the brood bitch need not be the owner of the produce. The produce must first be entered in the show's regular classes. Written critiques are not given.
- **Stud Dog (optional)** - Entered by the owner of the stud dog. The stud dog and at least two of his get must appear in the ring. The dog must have a USRC recognized Breed Test and have been at least 24 months of age at the time of breeding. The class is to be evaluated on the merits of the get. The owner of the stud dog need not be the owner of the get. The get must first be entered in the show's regular classes. Written critiques are not given.

Youth Handler Classes

Rules and Expectations from Youth Handlers

- A. USRC Youth Handler Program is open to youth from the ages of 8 to 18 as of the day of the event verified by a copy of legal documentation of child's age
- B. must be a family member of USRC to participate in the Program
- C. must be in possession of, and present at day of event, handler book in which results will be recorded
- D. youth are to present dogs no younger than 6 months in age, without illness or lameness, and within the Youth's ability to safely handle
 1. do not choose a dog that is too large or strong as it is important to maintain harmony with the dog and stay safe
 2. For the security of all participants, a dog that could be dangerous or a threat to its handler or any other person in the ring should not be shown. - The Judge will be the person in charge of deciding if a dog is considered safe to be in the ring.
- E. at all times during the event Youth Handlers are required to conduct themselves with good sportsmanship and courtesy to others.

F. The handler is recommended to use appropriate and functional clothing, such as shoes that are well adapted to the soil conditions and to the size of the dog. The colors of the handler's clothes should allow for the distinguishing of the dog's silhouette even from a distance, and any striking or inappropriate clothing is completely discouraged.

J. expected to be prepared, ready and at ringside when their class is called

K. follow judges/ring stewards direction as to line up inside of ring

L. handlers avoid standing between the judge and the dog

M. retain the leash in hand always

1. use the lead in his/her left hand and walk on the right side of the dog
2. The lead should be cleanly kept inside the hand

N. show dogs bite and open mouth

1. to check if the dog has a scissor bite, level bit or is undershot or overshot
2. to check for full dentition

O. know and demonstrate basic event routines

1. gaiting at a trot or walk depending on judge's wishes
2. front and back
3. triangle
4. around the ring
5. safe spacing between dogs

P. Sportsmanship

1. Never crowd out or run too close to other exhibitors
2. Keep your dog comfortable in the ring
3. Accept the Judge's decision
4. Be friendly and help others
5. Enjoy yourself and keep your calm
6. Don't be angry or sad when you lose-it is a learning opportunity
7. Remember to congratulate the winners with an honest smile
8. Praise and reward your dog
9. Make sure your dog is always safe
10. Enjoy and learn from the experience

- Copies of support documentation for all accomplishments and titles must be sent in with any entry for the Sieger, Champion or Working classes.
- Your dog's original registration, hip certification and support documents for all accomplishments and titles **MUST** be available at the show for inspection at the time of the class.
- **A valid USRC recognized hip certification, pass or fail is required on all dogs over the age of 30 months. Dogs that do not meet these requirements will not be permitted to enter.**
- The USRC Registration Certificate may be accepted as proof of titles earned and hip certification if the required information appears on the Registration Certificate.
- This is a German style conformation show. No dog shall be permitted to enter any class with missing teeth. **Docked Dogs welcome.**

- Dogs are shown in a natural stance; no hand stacking is allowed. Double handling is permitted; no food is allowed in the ring.
- Adult classes will be moved (run) long enough for the judge to evaluate dogs' movement and fitness. You may change handlers as needed.
- Event will be held outdoors, rain or shine.
- Bring your own chairs and anything else you may deem necessary for comfort for you and your dogs.
- **No dogs may be tied out at show site or ringside. Please have a crate for each dog. No X-pens are allowed,**
- **No dogs will be allowed within 50 feet of the show ring except those who are entered in the class that is being judged.**
- Please do not bring un-entered dogs to the show grounds.
- Please use designated areas to exercise your dogs and clean up after them.
- Dress is informal, sports attire is customary.
- Only Rottweilers with a valid USRC recognized registration (from AKC, CKC, USRC, or any FCI member Kennel Club) may participate
- Great food and beverages will be available at the show site.
- **A USRC recognized working title and breed test is required to be eligible for National Sieger or Siegerin.**

BSC Information and Entry Requirements

Copies of all documents must be uploaded to Zooza

- ❖ A USRC recognized registration certificate. (USRC, AKC, FCI, CKC).
- ❖ The dog must be tattooed or microchipped.
- ❖ Minimum age to enter the BSC is 15 months.
- ❖ A BH title is not required to earn a BSC, but if the dog has a BH then a copy of scorebook showing titles earned, scorebook number, and full name of dog must be submitted.
- ❖ If available, USRC recognized Hip, Elbow, Cardiac and/or JLPP Certification must be submitted (These health certifications are not required for the BSC but will be included on the certificate if available). Dogs without all health certifications will be designated as "Conforms to the Breed Standard" but are not designated as breedable. **All dogs must have their permanent identification (microchip or tattoo) indicated on all health certifications**
- ❖ Copy of any prior BSC attempts.
- ❖ Weight Certificate dated within 30 days of the test date.
- ❖ If your dog is registered with USRC a USRC Registration Certificate may be accepted as proof of titles earned and health certification(s) if the required information appears on the Registration Certificate.
- ❖ Bitches in season may participate; provided they are kept apart from the rest of the participants, and they must be presented last.
- ❖ Pregnant or nursing females are not permitted to participate.
- ❖ Spayed bitches may be presented for certification. Neutered males may be presented provided the dog has received a show critique from a USRC show as evidence that the dog's testicles were present prior to neutering.
- ❖ Dog may only be presented once per scheduled certification. There is no waiting period between attempts for dogs that did not pass a previous attempt.
- ❖ The only collar allowed is a fur saver.

BSE Information and Entry Requirements

Copies of all documents must be uploaded to Zooza

- ❖ A USRC recognized registration certificate. (USRC, AKC, FCI, CKC).
- ❖ The dog must be tattooed or microchipped.
- ❖ Minimum age to enter the BSE is 18 months.
- ❖ A BH title is not required to earn a BSE, but if the dog has a BH then a copy of scorebook showing titles earned, scorebook number, and full name of dog must be submitted.
- ❖ USRC recognized Hip, Elbow, Cardiac and/or JLPP Certification uploaded to Zooza with the entry. The originals of all of these documents must be presented to the secretary upon check in. **All dogs must have their permanent identification (microchip or tattoo) indicated on all health certifications**
- ❖ Copy of any prior BSE attempts.
- ❖ Weight Certificate dated within 30 days of the test date.
- ❖ If your dog is registered with USRC a USRC Registration Certificate may be accepted as proof of titles earned and health certification(s) if the required information appears on the Registration Certificate.
- ❖ Bitches in season may participate; provided they are kept apart from the rest of the participants, and they must be presented last.
- ❖ Pregnant or nursing females are not permitted to participate.
- ❖ Spayed bitches may be presented for certification. Neutered males may be presented provided the dog has received a show critique from a USRC show as evidence that the dog's testicles were present prior to neutering.
- ❖ Dog may only be presented once per scheduled certification. There is no waiting period between attempts for dogs that did not pass a previous attempt.

ZTP (BST) Information and Entry Requirements

Copies of all documents must be uploaded to Zooza

- ❖ The dog must be registered with USRC prior to the entry closing date. (Registration with AKC, CKC, or any FCI member Kennel Club is required for USRC Registration).
- ❖ The dog must have a USRC recognized BH upon check in for the Breed Test. If the BH is earned after the close of entries a copy of the scorebook showing the BH title must be presented to the ZTP secretary upon check in on the day of the breed test
- ❖ The dog must be tattooed or microchipped.
- ❖ The owner and the handler of the dog must be USRC members.
- ❖ The dog must have a weight certificate dated within 30 days of the test date.
- ❖ Copies of USRC membership cards for owners and handlers, copies of the entered dog's USRC registration and health certificates must be submitted with the dog's entry. The originals of all of these documents must be presented to the secretary upon check in. A dog's USRC Registration Certificate will be accepted as proof of titles and health certifications provided all required information is on the Registration Certificate. ** All dogs must have their permanent identification (microchip or tattoo) indicated on all health certifications**
- ❖ The dog must have a USRC recognized hip rating and must be rated as OFA excellent, good, or fair, ADRK HD-, HD +/-, HD+, or FCI HD A or B
- ❖ The dog must have a USRC recognized elbow rating and the elbows must be rated as OFA Normal, Grade I or Grade II, ADRK ED-, ED +/-, ED+ or FCI ED 0 or ED 1.
- ❖ The dog must have an OFA normal cardiac certificate
- ❖ The dog must have an OFA JLPP certificate
- ❖ The only collar allowed is a fur saver.

Körung Information and Entry Requirements

All Requirements from the ZTP are also applicable to the Körung, Additional requirements are listed below.

Gekört (First Körung)

- ❖ Males must be a minimum of 36 months of age. Females must be a minimum of 30 months of age.
- ❖ The dog must have passed a USRC recognized Breed Suitability Test prior to the entry closing date.
- ❖ The dog must have obtained three (3) show critiques with a SG or V Rating prior to the entry closing date. Two of these critiques must be from the Adult Classes and must be from 2 (two) different USRC recognized Judges.
- ❖ Males must have earned an IPO/IGP 3 title. Females must have earned an IPO/IGP1 title prior to the entry closing date.
- ❖ The dog must have passed a USRC recognized Endurance Test (AD) prior to the entry closing date.
- ❖ The dog must have correct mouth pigmentation and eye color (1a - 3a).

Gekört bis EzA (Lifetime Breed Survey) Same requirements as the ZTP and First Körung, with these additions.

- ❖ The dog must have passed a USRC recognized Advanced Breed Suitability Test/Gekört (ABST or First Körung) prior to the entry closing date.
- ❖ The Gekört bis EzA may be attempted no sooner than the following year at the same annual event where the Gekört was earned (i.e., if the Gekört is earned at the National Sieger show, the Gekört bis EzA may be attempted at the National Sieger show the following year)
- ❖ After obtaining a ZTP/BST and before attempting an Gekört bis EzA, a male must have sired at least 3 litters registered with USRC. A bitch must have whelped at least one litter registered with USRC.

Meet our Judge: *Claudia Meixner (ADRK)*

My name is Claudia Meixner and I have been an ADRK-judge since 2010. Since my birth I have been involved with Rottweilers. I grew up with Rottweilers and I accompanied my parents when they participated in shows and working trials. I also helped them to care of the puppies they bred. In 1983 I became a member of the Allgemeiner Deutscher Rottweiler Club (ADRK).

In 1984 I took part in a working trial for the first time at the age of twelve years. In that same year I became co-owner of the kennel „vom Schwaiger Wappen“.

Schwaiger Wappen Rottweilers were and still are very successful in both - show and work - worldwide. On many occasions over the years and still to date, Schwaiger Wappen Rottweilers have achieved some of the most prestigious show titles such as the following: Klubsieger, World Sieger, Bundessieger, Europasiieger, German Champion VDH and ADRK, International Champion and champion titles from many other places all over the world.

Until now I have trained around 25 Rottweilers and I have handled them in ZTP and from IPO1 to IPO3. I have also been successful on multiple occasions with my Rottweilers at several ADRK Körungs.

I served on the committee of the ADRK state-group 11 Bavaria North. From 1994 to 2004 I was the main breed warden for this state-group. I am currently still a licensed breed warden and have overseen over 250 litter-controls to date. From 2012 to 2014 I was Vice-President and since 2015 I have been president of the state-group Bavaria North.

I would like to thank the Mountaineer Work Rottweiler Klub for the invitation and I am looking forward to judge your dogs.



Meet our Judge: *Tim KARCHNAK (DVG)*

First I would like to say that I am honored to be asked to judge the upcoming USRC Regional Championship.

A little about myself, I first became active in working dogs when I was chosen in 1991 to become a K9 handler for my police department, Susquehanna Township, which borders the city of Harrisburg in PA. As a young handler I was introduced to the sport of Schutzhund by our trainer and joined my first club. During my K9 career I trained and handled three dogs for police work while at the same time training them in the sport.

K9 Danny Patrol / SchH 2, DPO 2 (German Shepherd)

K9 Nico Von Holzland Patrol / Narcotics SchH 3 . DPO2 (German Shepherd)

I eventually became the Trainer for the K9 Unit and had the good fortune to train with many great trainers throughout the country both in sport and police work. During this time I obtained National Level Helper Status and did helperwork at multiple Regional and National Competitions.

Upon retirement in 2015 I had my first Sport dog Monty Extra Temperament. (Belgian Malinois) AKA Goose. I was honored to represent the USA at One FCI World Championship and Three FMBB World Championships.

I started apprenticing during that time and received my judging license for DVG America in 2021. Besides being a Judge I am still a competitor and have a young dog I am in the process of titling and trialing . Nadal de Alphaville Bohemia IGP 2. (Belgian Malinois) AKA Duck.

What I really love about DVG is that it is an all breed organization. As an apprentice judge I was taught to judge such a variety of breeds, it truly makes you a well rounded judge.
